For women, the foundation embarked on a journey of content aggregation and development, focused on healthcare and fostering a better quality of life. From various open sources, we curated small booklets and concise videos to create a wealth of valuable resources.

Guided by our unwavering commitment to enhance STEM education in Indian languages, ensuring equitable access to cutting-edge learning content, we orchestrated a landmark one-day conference. This assembly brought together esteemed science educators, communicators, and policy-makers, forming part of our science communication popularization and extension (SCoPE) initiative in Bangla. Hosted near Kolkata in Rahara, this event became a platform for luminaries and enthusiasts to deliberate and propose actionable strategies, especially for underprivileged Bangla-speaking students.

Amidst these strides, Shanti Foundation successfully secured compliance and tax-benefit certificates, such as FCRA and 12AA/80G, facilitating streamlined fund-raising.

One-Day Summit: Catalyzing Bangla Science Communication & Education

Joint Endeavor by RKMVCC, Kolkata, & Shanti Foundation, New Delhi August 26th, 2023 Kolkata

August 26th, 2023 Rahara (Kolkata) —a day enshrined in the annals of intellectual awakening—witnessed the birth of a symposium that transcended the ordinary. The hallowed Maa Sarada Auditorium at Ramkrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College (RKMVCC) in Rahara, West Bengal, was the crucible for a symposium of profound import. Enigmatically titled "Science Communication: Igniting Legacy, Embracing the Present, and Forging the Frontier in Bangla," this symposium was an alchemical fusion of RKMVCC and the Shanti



Foundation. With the reverberations of Swami Kamalasthananda Ji's voice, the symposium unfurled at the stroke of 11:00 AM, ushering in a new era. His words, an anthem for the ages, resonated with the imperative of science communication as the bedrock of societal transformation.

The symposium's tapestry was interwoven with the presence of Dr. Nakul Parashar, an emissary of the Shanti Foundation, who articulated the symposium's raison d'être. A pause of reflection was dedicated to the memory of luminaries now in the realm of immortality—

Dr. Samar Bagchi, Dr. Bikas Kumar Sinha, Shri Kalyan Kumar Dasgupta, and Dr. C. R. Rao—whose brilliance continues to illuminate the corridors of science.

The symposium climaxed with the unveiling of six tomes, gems of knowledge in the realm of popular science. Among these, luminary works such as "Bigyan Panchashot: Ponchasti Lokbigyan Probondher Sonkolon" by Dr. Manas Pratim Das, "Alokbidyar Itikotha" by Dr.



Gautam Gangopadhyay, "Shankur Sakshate" by Dr. Sudakshina Gupta, "Nirbachito Jonbigyan Probondho Sonkolon" by Siddhartha Joardar, "Bheshoj Udbhid: Bharatbarsher Akti Amulya Sampad" by Dr. Tuhin Chatterjee and Dr. Sujay Pal, and "Ganiter Duniyai Kichukshan" by Dr. Bikas Chakraborty, illuminated the intellectual landscape. Amid these literary luminaries, the absence of Dr. Gautam Gangopadhyay was palpable, yet the eloquence of Dr. Shankarashis Mukherjee seamlessly unveiled his optics-oriented opus.

The symposium crescendoed in a panel discussion, "The Journey So Far," skillfully orchestrated by the doyen of science communication, Dr. Bhupati Chakraborty. The panel, a constellation of luminaries including Prof. Siddhartha Joardar, Prof. Shankarashis Mukherjee, Dr. Manas Pratim Das, Dr. Abhijit Bardhan, and Shri Amitesh Banerjee, embarked on a profound exploration of the SCoPE-Bangla movement's trajectory since its inception in 2019. With surgical precision, the session unveiled the movement's meta-

The symposium climaxed with Dr. Parashar's fervent declaration—the Shanti Foundation would nurture the flame of the SCoPE-Bangla movement, steering its destiny. This commitment entailed the stewardship of "Bigyan Katha," a monthly Bengali science magazine—epitomizing the movement's aspirations.

In an aria of gratitude, Swami Kamalasthananda Ji paid homage to attendees who shared a collective dream: advancing science communication and popularization in the Bengali language.














The symposium resounded with actionable manifestos:

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




Shanti Sandesh July-September 2023
